A Message from our Minister

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Francis and Clare,

Our next Gathering will be on Sunday, August 18th, Mass will be in the chapel at 12PM and our social will start at 1PM, please remember to bring your lunch and beverage. Our meeting and ongoing formation will begin at 2PM in the conference room next to the library.

I hope all had the opportunity to see some of the “World Youth Day” events in Rio De Janeiro, Brazil. It was estimated that over three million youth turned out for this wonderful celebration of faith. On the eve of the final closing, the theme was all about St. Francis of Assisi and rebuilding Jesus’ Church, the youth even built the frame of a church in front of the Holy Father. Pope Francis began his talk by recalling how centuries ago St Francis of Assisi heard Jesus’ voice from a crucifix telling him, “Go rebuild my house”. Francis responded “readily and generously to the Lord’s call”, he said, but it took him time to understand that “it was not a question of repairing a stone building” but of “doing his part for the life of the Church”. The event was truly Franciscan.

Pope Francis tells the youth that “we are to rebuild Jesus’ Church”. How appropriate in this “The Year of Faith”, that by living the Gospel life each and every day, we are rebuilding Jesus’ Church by our faith. As Franciscans this is what our commitment of profession means, to live the Gospel life and to not keep it to ourselves but to share with others. I was impressed by the number of youth wearing our Tau Cross, what a wonderful way of showing your faith, “a young church still full of hope.”

Starting with our October gathering we will be using the book, “Seeking a Gospel Life”. “The Wisdom of the Desert”

While cleaning and reorganizing some of my book shelves, I came across a book about a group of people who had decided that the world was a shipwreck from which they had to escape. They knew that one could not drift along passively and accept the tenets and values of a world careening towards disaster. No, this isn't current history, nor another story about Francis and his followers. This story took place about 900 years before Francis was born. It was not in the hill country of Assisi, but in the desert of Egypt. “The Wisdom of the Desert” by Thomas Merton (New Directions) is a very simple and straight forward book. It makes no pretense about being an intellectual treatise, but simply a “book designed for the reader’s interest and edification.” It begins with a brief, about 20 pages, summary of what the desert fathers were about, and then has 150 quotes, in no specific order or meaning, from the desert fathers. Interestingly, since I never bothered to translate the Roman numerals before, I just noticed that the number of quotes is the same as the number of Psalms. In many of the quotes, one can almost see Francis. For example,

MAX PICARD – Author of “Destroyed and Indestructible World”

"St. Francis of Assisi was completely and totally an exceptional man-exceptional in the immediacy of his love of Christ. With him, one did not find a path to Christ, immediacy had absorbed every path. In Francis, one finds immediacy in itself, absolute immediacy. Only love can be this absolute immediacy. Love, like immediacy, has no genesis, no development and no history; genesis, development and history are all absorbed in the being of love."

FEAST OF ST. CLARE – August 11th

Clare became aware of the fresh ideals of Francis and his brothers, who were trying to lead a radical following of Christ in utter poverty. She longed to become a member of the new movement, but she was a noble woman, and her only choice would have been that of joining one of the great monastic Orders for females, notably the Benedictines. An apostolic and itinerant life for a noble woman was not a common thing in the Middle Ages. After a period of reflection, during which Clare met Francis on some occasions, and most probably with the consent of bishop Guido of Assisi, Clare decided to choose a life of radical evangelical poverty.



During the night of Palm Sunday, Clare escaped from her family's home in Assisi and hurried down to the Porziuncola, where Francis gave her the habit of penance at the feet of the altar of the Virgin Mary of the Angels. That same night Clare was escorted to the Benedictine monastery of San Paolo in Bastia Umbra, where she was protected by papal interdict against possible intrusion by her family to take her back home by force. After some weeks Francis transferred Clare to another monastery at the foot of Mount Subasio, Sant'Angelo di Panzo. There Clare was joined by her sister Caterina (Sister Agnes). All attempts by the paternal uncle Monaldo to take back the two girls by force proved futile.

Francis then sent Clare and Agnes to the small church of San Damiano and gave them a Form of Life, which is the basis of the Rule of St. Clare. San Damiano was to be the place where Clare lived a cloistered contemplative life, but with great apostolic horizons, until the day of her death in 1253. The first sisters to join her would be called the Poor Ladies of San Damiano. Although compelled to accept the title of Abbess in 1215, a year later Clare asked Pope Innocent III to approve the Privilege of Poverty, by which the Poor Ladies were bound to live without property like the Friars Minor. This Privilege was confirmed by Gregory IX in 1228.

RETURN TO THE GOSPELS

"In the fullest meaning of the word Clare was truly Francis' * sister light * Not only by her advice and prayers, but also by the transparent beauty of her life and her whole being. When everything seemed to be crashing down around Francis, she was the living example of fidelity to his primitive ideal, to pure Gospel simplicity. She lived in God's time, like the stars, *clear, lovely and beautiful.* Without many words she made Francis understand that peace of heart was the highest form of poverty, the peace that comes from total surrender of self to God"
