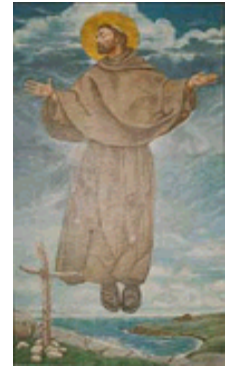

PROCLAIMING CHRIST IN AMERICA TODAY

Vatican City, (VIS) - Jesus Christ's love and the power of His grace must take root ever more intensely in the hearts of the people, families and Christian communities of nations, to allow them to progress with dynamism along the paths of harmony and fair progress".

Indeed, secularism and various religious groups are spreading throughout the continent, giving rise to numerous problems. Education and the promotion of a culture of life are matters of fundamental urgency in view of a widespread mentality that tends to attack the dignity of the person and damage the institution of marriage and family. How can one fail to be concerned about painful situations of emigration, displacement or violence, especially when linked to organized crime, narcotrafficking, corruption and arms dealing? And how should we face the painful inequalities and areas of poverty caused by questionable economic, political and social measures?"

The Pope emphasized that all these important questions require careful study, "yet in addition to their technical evaluation, the Catholic Church is convinced that the light for an adequate solution can only come from the encounter with the living Christ, which gives rise to attitudes and ways of acting based on love and truth. This is the decisive force which will transform the American continent. ... The love of Christ impels us to devote ourselves without reserve to proclaiming His name throughout America, bringing it freely and enthusiastically to the hearts of all its inhabitants. ... For this reason we ought to take up this commitment, ... encouraging priests, deacons and consecrated men and women and pastoral agents and laity to purify and strengthen their interior lives ever more fully through a sincere relationship with the Lord and a worthy and frequent reception of the sacraments. This will be encouraged by suitable catechesis and a correct and ongoing doctrinal formation marked by complete

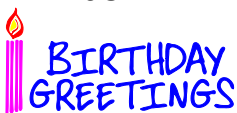

fidelity to the Word of God and the Church's Magisterium and aimed at offering a response to the deepest questions and aspirations of the human heart. ... A renewed missionary spirit and zealous generosity in your commitment will be an irreplaceable contribution to what the universal Church expects and needs from the Church in America", concluded the Pope.

Francis of Assisi and Innocent III: a shared dream?

Francesco met a Pope not open to dialogue, nor available to listen and, whatever the official hagiographies and some biographers, was not at all easy to get in 1221 rule approval.

Many re-readings of the fascination that affected dear Francesco exercised on historians, writers and theologians. Some foreign sources tell us that the Pope's reaction was, at the first meeting, negative: St. Bonaventure's biography States that Innocent III, at first, drove away with disdain, as troublesome, that strange visitor (cf. Legend greater 3.9). Innocent III was convinced to get those bums for a dream he revealed that after meeting the Poverello and because Francis replied to the objections of the Pope concerning the excessive rigour imposed by his rule, speaking of Lady poverty.

The Pope also became convinced that vision in a dream he had of the Lateran Basilica and falling a man, poor man, small of appearance, that claimed by putting under the shoulders because it fell. Beyond the truth of these stories, however, Pope Innocent III approved the rule, uncompromising and not cuts! The real miracle of this edifying tale is not the dream of Innocent III, nor are his alleged dreamlike revelations, but the very fact that a group of tramps had managed to have the hearing from a powerful and energetic Pope, who had no time to waste given the concerns that the Church alive in that time both ad intra (heretics) that ad extra (Princes and nobles, Kings and wars, armies and the Crusades). The miracle there was, all right!

I believe that at this very moment in the Catholic Church, the docility, humility and simplicity of the Poverello have reappeared as qualities of Papa Francesco who want attention for the poor and dreams a church naked, stripped of his own presumptions of truth and dedicated totally to Christ crucified and risen, who is present in the history of the last, of the abandoned, those are the standard of humanity and constitute the real rejection of society. *Father Edoardo Scognamiglio, OFM Conv.*
