“Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you.”— Matthew 28:19-20

Jesus’ great commission calls us to evangelize, to introduce others to Him, to share His good news with them, and inspire them to follow Him. The Rite of Christian Initiation for Children (RCIC)

This year I have the privilege to teach my parish’s first RCIC class. This class was created for children ages seven through high school who have not yet been baptized, but who are perhaps seeking the sacraments of initiation. This is a pre-Catechumenate period for the students in which I am called to “spark the fire” so to speak.

I will continue this summer, with the help of the Holy Spirit, to “tend the flames” within their hearts as every student desires to receive the sacraments!

The Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (Team RCIA)

More recently, RCIA at my parish has incorporated a year-long program. The program is very flexible, and those who are interested may enter at any time of the year. Being a Catholic convert myself, who went through the RCIA program thirty-five years ago, I share my own RCIA faith journey with the Catechumens, and in doing so, help them to feel more comfortable sharing their own.

I enjoy teaching occasional classes within this ministry, but most of all, I enjoy being involved with the Metanoia part of the year-round RCIA program in which we plan activities such as mini-retreats for Catechumens.

Teaching ministries such as RCIA, within our parishes, are opportunities for us to “tend our own flames” as we journey in Faith toward Perfection.

The Martha & Mary Meals Ministry

The Martha & Mary Meals Ministry at my parish provides home-cooked meals on a short-term, temporary basis, for those within our parish and those within our larger community who are facing difficult or challenging times due to illness, surgery, loss of a loved one, or financial difficulties.



As a member of this ministry, I help to prepare the meals and deliver them to the families in need. There have been times when we have prepared and delivered over 25 meals per month!

If your parish does not have a meals ministry, and you wish to be “the hands of Christ” in this world, consider taking a meal to someone in need. If you are invited inside, use this time to “set a spark” or “tend a fire”.

I was hoping that an opportunity to tutor in a homeless shelter would present itself to me; however, the very next day, I happened to be at my parish rectory, and I overheard a parent comment to someone that they were searching for a tutor for their child, but could not afford one. I immediately offered my services!

I have had the great joy of tutoring this precious child of God since last spring. I make a point to frequently remind her that she is an answer to one of my prayers and a gift to me from God. She always sighs, and shakes her head, and smiles at me. I see the light of Christ in her beautiful eyes.
