By living in the spirit, God becomes real to us and this reality of God in our lives can bring our humanity to the fulfillment that comes from sharing in the Divinity of Christ."

The Gospel life must be lived in such a way that Secular Franciscans witness to it. This is such a very important thing for us to keep in mind at all times. If we do not bear the responsibility we could risk the possibility of becoming a scandal.

To help us live the reality of God in our lives we need faith without questioning. We should help others believe by ourselves praying and living the faith.


