### To become an Instrument of Peace

Some aspects of the life of the Poverello (St. Francis) I would like to mention in particularly: First of all, it testifies to the profound reason of evangelical poverty, stripping in front of the father of his possessions, gave up this world to say in front of everyone, without any fear, that only Jesus Christ and his Gospel are the true and the only wealth of 'Men'. What does it mean for us the example of St. Francis? Last year in Assisi, at the tomb of Saint Francis, the Pope has asked all Christians to divest himself of the spiritual worldliness "which brings us to vanity, arrogance, pride." Contemplating the Crucifix of San Damiano, the invitation of Pope Francis encourages us to commit ourselves to seek the glory of God rather than our own, with right faith, certain hope and perfect charity.

Transformed by the experience of Jesus Christ, St. Francis was a man of peace and reconciliation. In the Apostolic Exhortation Evangelii gaudium the Holy Father has asked Christians "a witness of fraternal communion which becomes attractive and bright" (99). Let's go to Assisi to become we, like St. Francis, instruments of peace in a world where conflicts are growing and often result in dramatic violence. The intercession of St. Francis obtain for us the harmony and communion in the family, the workplace, in social relations, and each Christian fulfills his vocation as a servant of love and forgiveness, cooperating to build a society of peace.

In this time of severe economic crisis grows in our cities and towns, the number of poor. Pope Francis asks us to recognize in the poor "the suffering flesh of Christ" and to alleviate their sufferings. This was also the experience of St. Francis who, after recognizing the leper as the face of Jesus, began to attend the leper and to give help to those who were there, kissing their hands. We ask in prayer to St. Francis to help us accomplish, as he did, "the option for the past, for those that society rejects and throws away" (Evangelii gaudium, n. 195). The poor belong to us and Christian communities must have the same place in their hearts to God, that is to say - the Pope reminds us - "a preferential place."

Finally, in our pilgrimage, we will pray for the Pope, who constantly relies on the prayer of the Christian people. The Church joined by special ties to the successor of Peter, cannot fail to respond generously to this call. Let us ask the Lord for him health and strength for the work of ministry that Providence has entrusted him with exemplary dedication and that place every day.

St. Francis is a gift for our Church. It's really a day of grace for a new force in our Christian communities. Let us experience with spiritual intensity, and experience the joy of meeting with a great witness of the Gospel to be even more joyful and credible proclaimers of Christ and ferment of joy and peace in our living environments. - *President of the Regional Episcopal Conference to the Diocese of New York*.

## JESUS' COMPASSION IS LIKE A MOTHER'S LOVE by Pope Francis

Vatican City, 9 June 2013 (VIS) "Popular piety, embraces many symbols and the Heart of Jesus is the ultimate symbol of God's mercy. It is not, however, an imaginary symbol but a real symbol that represents the center, the source from which flows the salvation for all of humanity. When Jesus was already dead, a soldier pierced his side with a lance and immediately blood and water flowed out. "John recognized in that, apparently random, sign the fulfilment of the prophecies: from the heart of Jesus, the Lamb sacrificed upon the Cross, spring forth forgiveness and life for all humanity."

"But Jesus' mercy is not just a feeling. It is a force that gives life that brings humanity back to life! In the Gospel reading of the story of the widow of Nain. Jesus, with his disciples, is arriving in Nain, a village in Galilee, at exactly the moment of a funeral. A young man, the only son of a widowed woman is being carried out to be buried. Jesus' gaze immediately fixes upon the crying mother. The Gospel writer Luke tells us: 'When the Lord saw her, He was moved with pity for her'. This compassion is God's love for humanity. It is mercy, that is, God's attitude in contact with human misery, with our indigence, our suffering, our anguish. The biblical term 'compassion' recalls the maternal womb: indeed, a mother feels a reaction all her own when faced with her children's pain. That is how God loves us, Scripture says."

"And what is the fruit of this love, this mercy? It is life! Jesus said to the widow of Nain: 'Do not weep', and he called to the dead son and woke him as if from sleep. Let's think about this. It's beautiful. God's mercy gives life to the man, raises him from the dead. The Lord always looks upon us with mercy ... awaits us with mercy. Let us not be afraid to draw near to him! He has a merciful heart! If we show him our inner wounds, our sins, He always forgives us. He is pure mercy!"
