Lent is once again upon us and is a beautiful time for personal meditation and introspection. Each of us needs to ask how far we have traveled on our spiritual path and what peaks, valleys and deserts that journey has taken us through. The big question is how has each of us handle our journey? What was learned and what was changed? And the answer we give begs the question of how much trust and reliance on God exists in our daily lives?

Control is one of the major human foibles. Adam and Eve were the first “control freaks” if you will have it, by trying to wrest control of their lives and the Garden from God and humanity has been struggling with this ever since.

Our Franciscan philosophy tells us that “control” comes from the love Christ shows us on the Cross. We are most “in control” when we give all of our daily life to Christ. He asks us to trust in His great love for us and to let Him show us the way. He knows our struggles and our joys; our goodness and our darkness and His love never wavers. His Spirit is in us always tugging us gently to Him. Lent is a time to reconnect with this great love and to chart our spiritual map with our Divine Guide. Pope Francis stated in his 2014 Lenten message: *What gives us true freedom, true salvation and true happiness is the compassion, tenderness and solidarity of His love. Christ’s poverty which enriches us is His taking flesh and bearing our weaknesses and sins as an expression of God’s infinite mercy to us.*

May this Lent be a most wonderful and deeply spiritual time for each of us as we deepen our trust in and our love for our most high and glorious God.
