Minister's Minute-January 2016

“ Brothers and Sisters of Penance” (see RULE 7), Happy New Year!!!! What do we mean when we say that “Happy New Year”? Did you ever think about that? Care for Creation

In 2016, the plan is to continue with the straw-bale garden, increasing to 82 bales and planning for more double plantings. We plan to purchase a third box of Italian bees, to extract honey from hives #1 and #2, and hopefully produce a swarm or two. We plan to continue with the pollinator garden and possibly add a rain garden in the water runoff area and an herb garden in the water drainage

area. We also are planning to plant 60 bee friendly trees and bushes with a grant from Trees for Sacred Places. We also will continue to work towards making our parish more “Green”.

The Feb 13 meeting of Care for Creation at Our Lady of the Fields will be brainstorming ways to help our parish and communities become “more green,” focusing on education for recycling, reusing, and treating Creation with respect. Over Jan, Feb, and Mar the Ministry will be working on recruiting volunteers to work 4 to 8 bales for 2016, giving their time and talent to “listen to the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor.” (Laudato Si #49) The focus for recruitment will be through the faith formation office with parent meetings, confirmation classes, and the home school group. The pre-teen and teen groups will be participating in a contest to create a reusable bag for Our Lady of the Fields Care for Creation. Once the plan for 60 trees and bushes is approved by the archdiocesan office, we’ll remove 17 invasive trees for replacement and plant in the fall. There are 4 people from Our Lady of the Fields taking the Beekeeper Course at Arlington Echo and 2 have agreed to help be the beekeepers at Our Lady of the Fields.
