#### Minister's Message

My dear Brothers and Sisters,

The past few weeks have been very inspiring for me as a Franciscan as I interacted in prayer, conferences, discussions and laughter with my Franciscan brothers and sisters in the Region as well as from other parts of the country. I thank God abundantly for the experiences I have enjoyed.

June 29<sup>th</sup> I attended the Regional Chapter of Mats in celebration of 40 years of our Secular Franciscan Rule which was promulgated by Pope Paul VI in 1978. There were three previous Rules which *followed The Exhortation of St. Francis to the Brothers and Sisters of Penance i*n 1221 which contains the basis for penitential spirituality. These words of St. Francis are The Prologue to our present Rule. The Rule provides us with inspiration and guidance as to how we should live our OFS vocation. The Rule is something we promised to live when we made our Profession and should be taken seriously. At the Chapter of Mats each attendee was assigned a Group. On the final Day of our Conference, each Group reported. Many suggested an Action regarding the Rule was to pray with the Rule. Some said they would take a Rule each day to focus on and pray with and others one Rule a week. The important thing is to read, pray and focus with our Rule in whatever way one chooses. One of our sisters, Judith Tyrell O.F.S. of St. Conrad's Fraternity has written A Litany and Examination of Conscience based on the Rule of the OFS. The NAFRA website has a video and other resources to read and reflect on the Rule.

July13th-15<sup>th</sup>, I attended the Secular Franciscan Conference at St. Bonaventure University. The topic was Becoming Prayer, Becoming Presence. Donna Willard also attended and brought her sister Sandi. Bill Bouffard from St. Margaret of Cortona was also present. The Conference talks were given by Br. Richard Hendrick, OFM, Cap. from Ireland. The focus was prayer in its many dimensions and practices with a Franciscan perspective as well as well touching on some aspects of Teresa of Avila's teachings.

Br. Richard said "the goal of the Christian Journey can be summed up by the word Theosis. Theosis is a Greek word meaning to become as alike to God as it is possible to become. We need to become saints." He mentioned that in the Major Legend of Francis, Bonaventure wrote that" St. Francis not only prayed but became prayer." He cited Mt. 6:6 "But you, when you pray, go into your inner room......" Br. Richard explained that the "inner room" was a familiar image used by rabbis in Jesus' time to illustrate the inner room of the heart and the place of the spirit. Closing the door means turning inward to a time of silence and stillness. "Be still and know that I am God". It is the beginning of contemplative prayer. He mentioned that Teresa of Avila defined prayer as "simply conversing with someone whom I already know loves me".

It is a wonderful experience to pray, eat and socialize with Franciscans from our Region and from other Regions. Donna and I had the privilege of talking with Br. Richard for at least 45 minutes at the evening social. He was very gracious in answering our questions and sharing a little bit about his life in Ireland. The entire weekend was immersed in God's grace with Franciscan joy, love and community. It ended with a Mass in honor of the Feast of St. Bonaventure.
