#### Minister's Message

It seems odd to me that in today's world many people no longer believe in the Devil. Maybe that's because when most of us have encountered evil in our lives, it's been through the actions of human beings. Gossip, lies, theft, adultery, vandalism, and road rage are just the beginning of what could be a very long list. It's just a matter of time before each of us will have another brush with evil and we have no way of knowing when.

So does evil come only from human beings or do evil beings actually exist? The bible tells us: Then war broke out in heaven; Michael and his angels battled against the dragon. The dragon and its angels fought back, but they did not prevail and there was no longer any place for them in heaven. The huge dragon, the ancient serpent, who is called the Devil and Satan, who deceived the whole world, was thrown down to earth, and its angels were thrown down with it. (Rev. 12:7-9) Jesus said, "I have observed Satan fall like lightening from the sky." (Luke 10:18)

Evil beings, then, do exist but how is it that evil seems to come to us through people? Just like the angels, both good and bad, God has given people free will. Every day we are faced with many choices; whether to do God's will or our own. We get to choose whether to do good or evil, whether to sin or not; and every one of our decisions has consequences. When I was quite a bit younger I remember seeing a cartoon that showed a person with a little angel on one shoulder and a little devil on the other. Each was trying to persuade the person to do something; the angel wanted a good deed, the devil a bad deed. This image seems to sum things up nicely.

One of the favorite wiles of Satan is to create friction among people, as in the following instance, related by St. Bonaventure: One day St. Francis went to the city of Arezzo. There was a lot of dissention and unrest there and the city was beginning to fall into ruin. Francis beheld the demons dancing with joy on the walls of the city, and exciting in the hearts of its people the fire of hatred against each other. Calling to him Brother Sylvester, a man of dove-like simplicity, he said, "Go to the gate of the city, and in the name of Almighty God command the devils, in virtue of holy obedience, to depart immediately." The Brother hastened to fulfil his orders, and cried out in a loud voice, "All you evil spirits who are gathered together in this place, I command you, in the name of Almighty God and of His servant Francis, depart hence." No sooner had he uttered these words than the discordant voices were hushed, the people's angry passions were calmed, and peace was restored to Arezzo. The pride and jealousy of the infernal spirits had threatened the ruin of the city, but the wisdom of the humble Francis saved it from destruction.

As we see from this story, evil can threaten not only individuals, but whole towns, cities, and countries, as well; even the Catholic Church. Sadly, we have all heard recently of predatory priests preying on innocent children and getting away with it for years. It's been said that evil immerses things in a fog of confusion, which creates doubt and paralysis. As the church seeks to cast off this fog and take permanent and decisive action, we need to pray. Pray for those priests, pray for the many, many good priests, pray for the children, and pray for our church leaders. Brothers and Sisters we need to proclaim through our prayers, as Brother Sylvester did long ago, "in the name of Almighty God and of His servant Francis, evil - depart from our church." Let us commit to more deeply living our vocation as brothers and sisters of penance.
