# **Greetings from Brother Lawrence**

Greetings to one and all,

October is such a wonderful month and it begins with the feast of our founder, St. Francis. I was thinking about this change from summer to autumn and the feast of Francis and I began to wander off into thoughts of his humility. I began to ask myself the question of what his answer would have been if he were asked who is the founder of the Orders. Eventually, I came to the conclusion that he would have responded, "God is the founder of the Orders and I am simply its first member." I have really convinced myself that this is what he would have replied and I suppose my thought was, in part, a response to my teaching about grace here at Curley. It is a teaching of the theology of grace that God always initiates and humans respond to what God begins. God, therefore, initiated the Orders and Francis was the first to respond.

It is important for each and everyone of us to respond to the Lord's giving us the grace to answer the call to follow the path of Jesus. Unfortunately, I have to tell my students that that seems to leave us in the minority when we do so. It seems to me that many do not even hear God's initiation and still others refuse to respond to God and would rather do what they want to do. This is one of the wonderful responses that we can have in the world today. Follow the path of Jesus, it is the "Franciscan way of preaching" (not using words) that we must continue to do each and every day that may just impress someone to ask the question I am certain Francis himself had addressed to him so very often, "Why do you live and act the way that you do?"

As we move towards the end of the Church year and the holidays that follow let us remember that we are constantly responding to the graces given to us by God and not doing what we may necessarily want to be doing. We live, serve and follow the path set for us by Jesus and as Jesus showed others how to live so we continue to do that today, even in the autumns of the years.

# Minister's Message

The third of the Luminous Mysteries of the Rosary is the Proclamation of the Kingdom; every time I meditate on this mystery, I am reminded of the Gospel passage: "Seek ye therefore first the kingdom of God, and his justice, and all these things shall be added unto you." (Mt 6:33) In the order of mysteries of the Rosary, this mystery is right after the story of the Wedding at Cana. I thought it's interesting: our Lord teaches us to seek first the Kingdom of God, but, in fact, our Father granted us the worldly things (wine) at Cana before Jesus proclaimed the Kingdom of God. It was before Jesus began His ministry, and so He said, "My hour is not yet come." (Jn 2:4) However, our Father was not ignorant of our worldly needs, and acted first to grant us what we needed through Mary's intercession.



St. Louis de Montfort, in his book "True Devotion to Mary," compares the role of Mary with that of Rebekah, the mother of Jacob. (Gen 27) Rebekah, with the intention to make Jacob blessed by Isaac, prepared a dish in the way Isaac liked, covered his hands and neck with goatskins, and had Jacob bring Isaac the dish she had prepared. Rebekah was the one who knew what Isaac liked most. As Rebekah was a tender mother for Jacob, Mary is truly our tender mother. St. Montfort wrote "she knew all the secret ways of winning the heart of God." Mary, daughter of God, mother of God and spouse of God, knows what our Heavenly Father likes most. Our prayers, devotions and charities are defective because of our infirmities. We may pray improperly. We, by nature of our imperfection, may seek our wills rather than the Father's will. However, as Rebekah prepared a dish in the way Isaac liked (Gen 27:9), our Blessed Virgin Mary may prepare our prayers and devotions and ourselves in the way acceptable to the Father. It's the beauty of the Rosary. While going through the meditations on Jesus's birth, life, death and resurrection, we also rely on Mary for her intercession. ~James Kim, OFS

# John Patrick Kirby Jr (1929 to 2021) ~Cindy Mohler OFS

On September 12, 2021, our beloved Secular Franciscan brother, John, returned to the Lord at the age of 92. He was one of the founding members of our St. Joseph Cupertino fraternity which met in several places, over the years, before settling in our current home at the Shrine of St. Anthony. John introduced me to the Secular Franciscans.

John grew up in Williamsport, PA, the home of the Little League World Series, for which he was very proud and returned every year to see it. John served in the US Air Force and spent a short time at St. Charles Seminary. He worked for Catonsville Recreation and Parks. He resided in Catonsville with his parents to whom he was very devoted. After their passing, he stayed in Catonsville.




He was proud of his Irish heritage and loved to sing. John was a member of the Irish Men's Choir which performed at area nursing homes and parades. He could be seen often in his green sport jacket along with his great Irish smile and friendly personality.

John was truly Franciscan and lived out the Beatitudes, especially "the poor in spirit." Every Sunday, he could be seen in the first pew at St. Marks with two disabled boys that he would bring to Mass and then take them to breakfast afterwards at McDonalds or Double T Diner. He would offer money to anyone he thought needed it and would literally deprive himself of essentials to be able to do so. He would even put his food on the porch in the winter to keep it cold when his electricity was turned off because he couldn't afford it. He wore his green sport jacket to the end along with his tattered shoes. John gave of himself as did our father, St. Francis.

He entered Brightview Assisted Living with the help of his pastor and assistant. When visiting him, he could be found exercising, singing, visiting other patients or in Bible studies. He truly lived the life of our father, St. Francis as he preached frequently - sometimes using words.

## St. Gregory the Great's Homily 34 on the Gospels (On the Angels # 11& 12)

When asked what she would like to share with the fraternity this month, our dear sister Jeanne mentioned that she especially loved the 2nd Reading from the Office of Readings on the Feast of the Archangels; researching this reading, I found that it was but a drop in the bucket of a wonderful homily. I encourage everyone to read the full text (Gregory the Great Homily 34 on the Gospels - Patristic Bible Commentary (google.com)). The section below contains St. Gregory's reflection on what it will be like for us in heaven with the angels. While I have considered what heaven will be like for humans & animals, I really have not figured the angels into the equation. I suppose I just thought they would all be worshipping God in the air and we would be in His



presence on the ground level. You can see that I haven not fully thought this out, but St. Gregory has. Let us consider how we live our life now impacting more fully how we live our life in community with the angels as we all worship God forever.

In bad theological terms, but an easy analogy, consider the holiday movies about Santa's workshop: imagine that you are a young human adopted by elves and need to determine your place. Will you be maker of a practical toy, a shiny toy, or a game that inspires others to play together? How will you help Santa bring joy and love to everything? Carefully consider what training you would need: woodworking, servant leading, painting, singing, and even healthcare training. That is what we must discern now. What talents has the Lord given you? Are you developing them? Will you be ready to enter into the great workshop of delights when you die, or will you need further time to prepare? Brothers and Sisters, Christmas—the true Christmas of the Incarnation (the spirit of love behind the secularized holiday) is such a gift from a loving Father and Brother and Spirit—please show your thanks by considering the words of St. Gregory:

But what good is it to say these few words about the angelic spirits, if we do not bother to turn them to our progress by an adequate reflection? The heavenly city is made up of angels and men, and we believe that there will be as many representatives of the human race as there have remained of the chosen angels, as it is written, "He has set the limits of peoples according to the number of angels of God." (Dt 32:8) We must therefore profit for our lives from the distinctions that exist between the inhabitants of the city from above, in order to inflame ourselves with a holy ardor to grow in virtue. For if it is true that the number of men destined to ascend to Heaven is equal to that of the angels who have remained there, those same men who return to the heavenly homeland must imitate in something the militia they join there. The different ways of life of men correspond, indeed, to each of the [nine] orders of the heavenly militia, and we receive a place in their ranks according to the similarity of our way of living with theirs.
