

"...He remembered that [passage] of the psalm: *I have sworn and determined to keep the justice of the Lord and to observe the Rule that the Lord Himself gave to me and to those who desire to imitate me. All these brothers have also bound themselves to this as I have. And therefore, after I resigned the office among the brothers because of my illnesses and other reasonable causes, I am not bound at all except to pray for the religion and to show good example. For I have this from the Lord and know in truth that if my illness had not excused me, the greater help I can render to the religion is to spend time every day in prayer to the Lord for it, that He govern, preserve, and protect it.*"

"The solemn yet harried preparation for a holiday feast is usually the image accompanying the December calendar in a Book of Hours. The image displayed here is a rare and delightful departure from convention. Through color the artist has beautifully captured the chill of a winter day, and he skillfully conveys the excitement of a snowball fight. All is not play, however, for in the distant background, work still goes on. But for a wonderful moment, the world is a playground. This Prayer Book was created ca. 1520-30, likely in Brussels, in the style of the Master of Charles V. It consists entirely of single folios that were added in or moved around in the book, rendering collation unfeasible. Many of these intricate and high-quality miniatures were reproduced through chromolithography by Léon Gruel in his *Petites Heures*, published in Paris in 1875. The calendar is especially charming and features seasonally relevant illustrations. The suffrages contain detailed and illusionistic figures, including one for St. Elizabeth of Hungary. 
Franciscan at Home: Free Online Courses

is a new initiative by Franciscan University of Steubenville. The program offers open online courses at no cost for individuals seeking to better market themselves in the workplace, to explore academic fields, or simply for the love of learning. Courses will be available in a variety of disciplines and are faithful to the Magisterium of the Catholic Church. Upon completion of a course, students will receive a "Statement of Completion."



The inaugural course is presented by Franciscan University president, Fr. Dave Pivonka, TOR and is entitled "The Theology of Pilgrimage." This course, built upon Pope St. John Paul II's statement that "all of the spiritual life is a pilgrimage to the heart of the Father," reflects upon the human journey towards heaven. Whether you are preparing for a physical pilgrimage or are merely seeking spiritual formation for the trials and struggles of daily life, Fr. Dave's reflections on his own spiritual journey—drawing especially from his pilgrimage on the Camino de Santiago—will draw you closer to the heart of the Father. The Rule Review



So that we might more fully live the Gospel Life, Secular Franciscans should not just read *The Rule*, but reflect on and pray with *The Rule*.

23. Requests for admission to the Secular Franciscan Order must be presented to the local fraternity, whose council decides upon the acceptance of new brothers and sisters.³⁷ Admission into the Order is gradually attained through a time of initiation, a period of formation of at least one year, and profession of the Rule.³⁸ The entire community is engaged in this process of growth by its own manner of living. The age for profession and the distinctive Franciscan sign are regulated by the statutes.³⁹ Profession by its nature is a permanent commitment.⁴⁰ Members who find themselves in particular difficulties should discuss their problems with the council in fraternal dialogue. Withdrawal or permanent dismissal from the Order, if necessary, is an act of the fraternity council according to the norm of the constitutions.⁴¹

23. 재속 프란치스코회의 지원은 단위 형제회에 하며, 평의회가 새 형제들의 입회 여부를 결정합니다. 정회원 입적은 예비기를 제외하고, 적어도 1년간의 양성기를 거쳐 회칙 서약으로 이루어집니다. 이 단계적인 기간동안 전체 형제회는 그들의 생활 태도로 책임을 져야합니다. 서약을 하는 연령과 재속 프란치스코회의 독자적 표지는 제반 규정으로 정합니다. 서약은 그 성질상 영구적인 의무입니다. 특별한 난관에 봉착한 회원들은 자기의 문제를 평의회에서 형제적인 대화로 토의할 수 있습니다. 탈회 혹은 결정적인 제명이 필요한 경우에는 회헌의 규정에 따라 형제회의 평의회가 결정합니다.


