Greetings from Brother Lawrence, OFM Conv.

Good day,

I was supposed to begin to write about Solanus Casey this month but I am postponing that until October as I feel the need to write about the need to think about the prospect of vocation to Franciscanism. I was quite pleased to see so many interested visitors at the last several meetings and I am encouraged that the fraternity may be moving to grow more in this post-COVID age. I am also encouraged by the increase in students at Curley who are thinking about vocation to priesthood or brotherhood in the Franciscan Order. I see a turn to more vocations from the younger generation and I believe that God is still calling people to these various vocations.

I must admit that for most of my religious life this has not been very encouraging but it now seems to be moving in that direction. I remember my Church history teacher in my graduate studies in theology say that the vocation "crisis" was not really a crisis but that a return to the normal level of vocations after most of the 20th century being much higher than ever before. Fr. James Hennessy often times in class speaks of this and so I think that now we are returning to a better interest in vocations by the young. I have discussed this with some of my students who approach me and this is most encouraging.

It is most important that the fraternity continue to seek and invite new members to your fraternity and way of life. I truly believe that there are people out there whom God is calling to be Secular Franciscans. Sometimes I am surprised about who comes to talk to me in school about it and, of course, they do not all accept such a call but their very interest is encouraging. God has not stopped the calling to vocations within the Church but it seems now that more people are beginning to consider that call. So let us continue to pray for those vocations today and, as promised, God will provide.

Minister's Note

I read an interesting article this month that posed the question of "How much stuff do we really need?" If we are to live in a way that is simpler, does our stuff hold us back? Maybe there are other things in life that are filling our calendars and hearts that are not helping to the goal of becoming a saint.

A call to living a simple life isn't easy. We want our homes to be comfortable and welcoming to others. But all too easily these items can become clutter. They leave less room for joy and ease. Last week, I filled and donated a truck bed full of knick-knacks and other tchotchkes from our nook and crannies. I don't miss any of those items.

Beyond the material items, we can also stuff our calendars so full that there is no time to be still, or to find joy. We are marking off the to-do list in the name of "productivity," but not really being present in our own lives. There is no time for long conversations or time to really reflect on our call to live out the Gospel. I can't add to my calendar without looking at what is already there. I started to delete some of those not so necessary commitments.

Saint Francis opened the Gospel three times, and heard "Get rid of things; take nothing for the journey, and Follow Me." For myself, I believe that we need to take not only physical action, but also spiritual action to rid ourselves of the things that are not helping us to get to heaven.

Maybe it is gossip. Maybe it is an addiction. Maybe it is the hundreds of books that line the shelves that no one will read again. Maybe it is events that do not promote the Gospel way of living. We need to look at what is cluttering our lives without filling us up with good things.

A call to the simple life as a Secular Franciscan will look different for each person. We are to live out our vocation in our ordinary lives. I hope that you will consider what you are filling your life with and ask: "Is it True? Is it Beautiful? Is it Good?" Those are the things that should be filling our homes and hearts.
